**Summary** 

The project aims to foster and broaden knowledge about how art can contribute to the development of skills required for the intercultural adaptation of immigrants and members of the receiving community. The international team of the project brought into completion the following activities. **Research**: systematic study of all relevant theories and investigation of worldwide literature about the arts and intercultural adaptation, collection of the international good practice guides and the appropriate methods of evaluation and compiling a list of quantifying indices, **6 international collaborative meetings** (Paris, Madrid, Budapest, Nafplion, Cambridge), **14 pilot programmes in which immigrants and locals participated**, and in which various forms of art were utilized (forum theatre, dance, visual arts, photography, audiovisual material, creative writing, etc.) with a view to enhance intercultural adaptation, an **International Conference in Budapest**, Hungary, 29-30 November 2012, whose aim was to present the results of the programme and to organize collaborative workshops by using the same forms of art that the participating bodies used in their own workshops with teams of immigrants. Participation of several conference members from several European countries in addition to those countries involved in the programme.
