ARGOS is a collaborative project of partners having diverse but complementary backgrounds. The aim of the project is to investigate the space of dynamic encounters between academics and artists while focusing on the study of the endeavours and the artistic creation using new technical means such as virtual reality. The project is intended to create innovative conditions with the aim of disseminating knowledge related to the creative process in the performing arts. Thanks to the project, researchers, artists and professionals in the performing arts will be in contact with one another, something which will facilitate the development of skills and the dialogue between various professions. In this context, five experimental activities will take place in five countries (Italy, Belgium, France, Portugal, and Lebanon) so that all involved in the project may establish ways of identifying and creating links among the bodies, the academics, the employees in the field of culture, the wider audience and the students. The outcome of the project is a "European Network of Creativity" and communities of "Observers" who will be capable of promoting the mobility of artists and artistic projects as much as academic and professional activities in the field of education.
